The assessment of that material, and of all the circumstances of what is a quite complex situation, reveals no instances of staff misconduct or corrupt conduct. Rather, the actions of DETE staff appear motivated by attempting to provide support and protection to a who is undergoing a particularly difficult period which has placed staff in somewhat extraordinary situations. As a result of this assessment, the Department will take no action from a disciplinary investigation process.

There are; however, outstanding issues with respect to how the staff at the school are managing the complex situation with the particularly concerning the role the staff at the school are undertaking concerning emotional support to the and how that interfaces with the QH plan. I understand that DETE and QH have met with staff at the Barrett School as recently as yesterday to discuss the overall needs of

To ensure; however, the specific needs of the particular are being met; to clearly understand the management plan for this and as well as some strategies to adopt when facing such dilemmas/situations, if not already undertaken , I suggest Mark consider further liaison with Professor Crompton with a view to perhaps meeting with the Principal of the Barrett School to discuss the
